DURBAN TERMINALS OPERATIONAL STATUS UPDATE

The operations within the Durban Terminals are still moving in a positive trajectory. We are pleased to report that in the past week Pier 1 managed a total of 6297 gate moves and Pier 2 a total of 20 510 gate moves. The backlog of imports at Pier 2 has been cleared and the focus is on releasing imports for the current vessels. The high number of appointments cancelled and wasted remains a concern and is adversely affecting the evacuation of containers as slot availability. Below is the current operational update per terminal for your information:

	Waterside	The Terminal has planned four gangs for today. There are currently two vessels
		on the berths with no vessels at anchorage. All vessels are berthing according
		to their CTOC windows. The stack occupancy has increased to 57.2%. The
		volume achieved in the past 24-hours 2226 TEUs against a plan 2500TEU's.
		There is one vessel stack that is open. The focus will be on vessel operations.
	Landside	In the past 24-hours the terminal worked 570 gate transactions against a target
		of 1500 because of low traffic volumes. There is total of 2580 import containers
		to be evacuated by road. The Terminal is geared up to exceed the target of 1500
Pier 1		gates moves if there is an adequate flow of trucks dispatched to the Terminal
		given that all available imports are released for collection. The landside will
		operate as normal via the appointment system with detailed communication
		shared via the usual platforms by the respective Terminals.
	Rail	The Terminal has planned one gang; however, rail is not operational due to the
		closure of NATCOR, therefore resources have been deployed to the landside.
		Engagements have taken place with customers to amend cargo to Bayhead
		Terminal so that transporters can uplift from Bayhead Terminal. This will reduce
		the dwell time of NATCOR cargo in the Terminal.
		The Terminal's staffing capability is twelve gangs; however, seven gangs have
	Waterside	been planned for today. There are three vessels that are on the berths with one
		vessel scheduled to berth at 203 at 12h00 today. One vessel completed
Pier 2		yesterday. There are zero vessels at outer anchorage. The focus will be on
		vessel operations. The stack occupancy is at 65.5% and reefer stack occupancy

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		is at 52%. The terminal achieved a volume of 2805 TEUs against a plan of 3500 TEU's this was due to a vessel changeover at berth 108.

		of 3500 gate moves with 222 slots wasted and 2046 cancelled. There is a total
		of 6503 import containers to be evacuated by road.

		Appointment slots are allocated at 120 slots per hour. Export stacks for dry cargo
		has also opened for specific vessels and the detailed communication is being
		shared via the usual terminal platforms
	Rail	The Terminal has planned one gang and loaded one train. The focus is on
		working railing containers to Bayhead Terminal and rail transfers from Buffers
		one and two. NATCOR line remains suspended.
	Waterside	There are two vessels on the berth with a staffing level of four gangs and one
MPT	Watereda	vessel at outer anchorage. In the past 24-hours the terminal achieved a volume
		of 1612 against a plan of 1800. The stack occupancy is at 58%. The focus is on
		dispatching breakbulk and containers to create space.
	Landside	The volumes worked on landside was 1108 tons against a plan of 1000 tons for
	Lanasiae	breakbulk and 235 TEUs against a target of 200 TEU's for containers.
	Rail	Operations remains suspended.
	Waterside	The Terminal is operating with four gangs. There were two vessels on berth with
CAR	1141010140	zero vessels at anchorage. In the past 24 hours the terminal achieved a volume
VAIN		of 2066 against a plan of 2227. The stack occupancy is 35%. In next 24-hours
		the terminal has planned six gangs with three vessels on the berth. The focus is
	l ondeide	on dispatching cargo to create space.
	Landside	Terminal remains operational, all imports are available for collection. In the past

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		24-hous the terminal worked 1430 gate transactions against a target of 2153.
		Customers are expected to uplift as many imports as possible to create space in
		the terminal. Exports units are coming slowly due to limited road hauler capacity.
	Rail	Operations remains suspended.
	Waterside	The Terminal is operational with staff compliment of 100%. There is one Coal
MAYDON		vessel on berth working two gangs as planned and loaded 4402 tons against a
WHARF		plan of 4400 tons. The other Coal vessel is at anchorage, awaiting availability of
		deeper draft berth.
	Landside	Is Operational and receiving Ferrochrome/Chrome trucks. In the past 24 hours
		the terminal managed 1120 tons against a plan of 875 tons. Stack Occupancy is
		95%.
	Waterside	The Terminal is operational with staff compliment of 100%, however the terminal
AGRI		was not operational in the past 24-hours. There is one maize vessel at anchor
		which is undergoing repairs due to a breakdown of the vessels anchor. The
		revised ETB is 25 April 2022
	Landside	No Activities
